Dear Secretary Ortega:

As Temple's new president, I'm honored and energized to lead our collaboration with the Commonwealth in educating future leaders and strengthening our economy.

Since arriving at Temple, I have identified three strategic priorities. Number one is to raise the reputation and profile of Temple University to drive innovation and prosperity in the region. This is a best-in-class university for studying, to teaching, athletics, and extracurricular activities, and I want all of Pennsylvania, the country and the world to know this.

Number two is to fortify our curriculum ensuring that our students thrive as members of the future workforce. Because technology and business evolves by the day, the way that we learn has to adapt and evolve, as well. For many students, the job that they will have in 10 or 15 years from now does not yet exist, but we're going to make sure that they'll be agile and ready to seize opportunity.

Number three is engaging with our community in a more definitive way. Our location in North Philadelphia provides us with many valuable opportunities, and we are going to pursue them with focus and determination. Whether it's corporate partnerships, connecting with the residential community or collaborating with local policymakers or leaders, we are going to be deliberate in identifying ways in which we can further solidify our standing as "Philadelphia's Public University," a title that we wear as a badge of honor. I look forward to sharing news about our community partnerships in the months ahead.

### **Combating COVID-19**

As you know, one of the immediate challenges facing both Temple and my new presidency is the COVID-19 pandemic. While we're in a much better place than we were last year, we must remain vigilant and ready to adapt.

The resilience and response of our community has been exceptional--we have strategic, knowledgeable and flexible individuals at the ready throughout the university. They are committed to ensuring the health and safety of everyone from students and patients to faculty, staff, and neighbors.

Within just weeks of my presidency, we launched the University's #VaxUpTU campaign and then on August 13, we followed the City of Philadelphia's COVID-19 vaccine mandate and required all Temple University faculty, staff, students and contractors to receive the vaccine. Over the next two months, our COVID-19 Steering Committee worked diligently to vaccinate as many members of our community as possible. Today, on Nov. 3, I am pleased to report that nearly 96% of our entire on-campus community—more than 40,100 individuals in total—are fully vaccinated.

Our campus is regaining its hallmark vibrancy and our students are enjoying the many benefits provided by an inperson collegiate experience.

### **College affordability**

We know that the cost of a college education is something that weighs heavily on the minds of our students and their families. That's been further magnified in the wake of the pandemic. Because it is such a financially difficult time for students and families, we aimed to balance a small tuition increase (+2.5%) with a budget cut (-3%). That balance will help ensures that students' educational experience is not impacted. This was Temple's first in-state tuition increase since the 2018–2019 academic year.

We also continue to proactively assist students in need. Approximately 18.5% of our undergraduate revenue this year is allocated to financial aid, which equates to more than \$100 million. We have also allocated \$69 million of our share of federal stimulus to help students financially.

Our Fly in 4 program also continues to be key in this regard. One of the first programs of its kind in the U.S., Fly in 4 helps students stay on course academically and financially by offering a clear four-year academic plan focused on graduating on time. By graduating in four years, students avoid the extra costs associated with taking on additional semesters.

#### DEI is an educational imperative

Diversity, equity, inclusion - as well as access - is an educational imperative under my leadership.

I am proud that our the freshman class, the Class of 2025, is the most diverse class of students that Temple has welcomed to campus in at least 25 years. Nearly 45% of the class are students of color—up from 31% just five years ago. We also experienced a 23% increase over last year in first-year Black students, with 831 enrolling, and a 4% increase in Hispanic/Latinx/Latine students, with 458 enrolling. In terms of socioeconomic diversity, 30% of our first-year students will be the first generation in their families expected to graduate from college, while 28% are receiving Pell Grants.

We are also dedicated to providing academic pathways to college for Philadelphia high school students. The Cecil B. Moore Scholars Program is a flagship program we launched this year and an exceptional example of the types of pathways we are pursuing.

Through this dual enrollment program, 50 high school students from Philadelphia public (district or charter) schools are selected to enroll in a free Temple course that they complete during their senior year of high school. From those 50 students, 20–25 of them are selected to become Cecil B. Moore Scholars (full tuition for all four years) and attend a summer bridge program before enrolling at Temple as firstyear students. This program is meant exclusively for students living in the eight North Philadelphia zip codes surrounding the university who attend Philadelphia public (district or charter) high schools.

We have also prioritized DEI as imperative with our faculty and staff.

Our Center for Advancement of Teaching (CAT) has established the Teaching for Equity Institute, whose mission is to foster knowledge, attitudes and skills among faculty that lead to equitable teaching practices and learning environments. In the Fox School of Business, we also recently launched the Center for Ethics, Diversity and Workplace Culture (CEDWC), a new hub for research, dialogue and innovation focused on diversity, ethical decision-making and the creation of healthy workplace cultures.

We are also particularly proud of our newest research facility the Center for Anti-racism Research, which is currently under construction and set to open this spring. This project is part of the more than \$1 million that we previously announced would be invested in anti-racism education and programming.

The annual appropriation from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is key in allowing us to create initiatives like this. It also helps keep tuition costs low, and is a primary driver behind providing students with access to our high-quality education.

I want to again thank you and everyone at the Department of Education for your unwavering support. Though I have only been on the job a few short months, it is abundantly clear that your partnership is vital to Temple.

I look forward to working with you well into the future.
